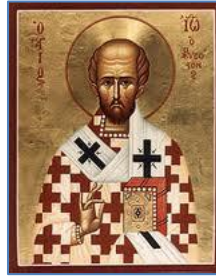

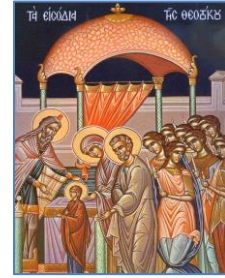

- **Keeping the Nativity Fast - From the Bulletin of S.S. Cyril & Methodius**
 - 1) Be consistent and regular in prayer
 - 2) Confess sometime during this season
 - 3) Keep the fast as best you can
 - 4) Do these things in order prepare for the feasts of the appearing of the Lord, the birth and the Baptism of Christ

“We are bound to thank God always for you, brethren, as it is fitting, because your faith grows exceedingly, and the love of every one of you all abounds toward each other, so that we ourselves boast of you among the churches of God for your patience and faith in all your persecutions and tribulations that you endure, which is manifest evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you also suffer; since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with tribulation those who trouble you, and to give you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.” 2 Thessalonians 1:3-8

Commentary: “Do not be vengeful; do not return evil for evil. The evil of your neighbor is sufficient. If you return him evil for evil, you double the amount of evil in the world; but if you do not return him evil, he may yet burn out his own evil through repentance, and you will then have lessened the evil in the world by your patience and forgiveness... Wait on the Lord... If you engage in battle with the evildoer, you may be overcome. Renounce your fight, therefore, and hand it over to the One who is victorious and unconquerable and wait with patience. Learn from the little child: when he is attacked by someone in the presence of his parents, he does not return the attack but runs to his parents and bursts into tears. He knows that his parents will protect him. How do you not know that which a little child knows?... Therefore, do not be vengeful. Do not return evil for evil, but look to your Father and cry to Him. Only in this way will you guarantee victory for yourself in the clash with evil men.” Bishop Nikolai Velimirovic
